


Defining the Different iPhone Editing Controls



1. Magic Wand: Auto Enhance a great way to start your edit.
2. Exposure: Acts as though more or less light got into the lens
3. Brilliance: Lighten shadows while toning down highlights.
4. Highlights: Adjust the brightness of the lightest parts in the image.
5. Shadows: Adjust the brightness of the darkest parts in the image.
6. Contrast: Make the darker parts darker and the lighter parts lighter.
7. Brightness: Make the entire image lighter or darker.
8. Black Point: Adjust the very darkest part of the range.
9. Saturation: Change the intensity of the colors in the image.
10. Vibrance: Change the intensity of the least saturated colors.
11. Warmth: Adjust yellow or blue tones to warm or cool an image.
12. Tint: Adjust the green or magenta tones in your image.
13. Sharpness: Sharpen the edges of your image.
14. Definition: Make the details in your images clearer.
15. Noise Reduction: Reduce the graininess of your image.
16. Vignette: Darken the corners of your image.

You can make changes by sliding the bars left or right to see real-time changes. Feel free to experiment until you get the desired look and click done.

Creating Photo Albums on iPhone

Create a New Album

1. Open the Photos app on your iPhone.
2. Tap on Albums at the bottom of the screen.
3. Tap the + icon to create a new album.
4. Select New Album.
5. Enter a name for your album and tap Save.
6. Choose the photos you want to add to the album and tap Done.

Organizing Albums in Folders

To keep your albums organized, you can create folders:

1. Open the Photos app.
2. Tap on Albums.
3. Tap the + icon and select New Folder.
4. Name the folder and tap Save.
5. Open the folder, tap Edit, and then tap + to create new albums within that folder.

Renaming and Deleting Album


1. Go to Albums.
2. Tap the album you want to rename.
3. Enter the new name and tap Done.
4. To Delete an Album:
 1. Go to Albums.
 2. Touch and hold the album you want to delete.
 3. Confirm the deletion. Note that this will not delete the photos within the album from your library.

Sharing Albums

1. Open the Photos app and go to Albums.
2. Select the album you want to share.
3. Tap the Share button and choose your sharing method (e.g., AirDrop, Messages, Mail).

These steps will help you effectively create and manage photo albums on your iPhone.

Snapseed - Complete and professional photo editor developed by Google.

Lightroom for iPad - Is a mobile app that allows users to edit and organize their photos with many of the same features found in the desktop version.

Handy Photo - Has many interesting tools: a smart brush, selective editing, frames, the function of the "Magic crop", apply filters and textures, retouch the photo.


Photos - Amazon Prime free unlimited cloud storage for Prime members

CropSize - Is for precise image resizing and editing. Make your photos the perfect size, composition, and quality for photo library, social media, and various projects.

Transferring Photos to a PC

Using a USB Cable

1. **Connect Your Device:** Use a USB cable to connect your smartphone or camera to your PC.
2. **Unlock Your Device:** Make sure your device is unlocked. If prompted, select "Trust" or "Allow" on your device.
3. **Open Photos App:** On your PC, open the Photos app.
4. **Select Import:** Click on "Import" and choose your connected device.
5. **Choose Photos:** Select the photos you want to transfer and choose where to save them.
6. **Complete Transfer:** Wait for the transfer to finish before disconnecting your device.

Using Cloud Services

- **iCloud:** If you use an iPhone, enable iCloud Photos to automatically sync your photos to your PC via iCloud.com.
- **Google Photos:** For Android users, upload photos to Google Photos and access them from your PC using a web browser.

Using Wireless Methods

- **Phone Link App:** For recent photos, use the Phone Link app on Windows to view and copy photos without a USB cable. This requires an Android device with OS 7.0 or newer.
- **Bluetooth:** Enable Bluetooth on both devices, pair them, and send photos from your phone to your PC.

Troubleshooting Tips

- **Check USB Cable:** Ensure your USB cable supports data transfer.
- **Change USB Settings:** If your device is not recognized, change the USB setting to "File Transfer" or "MTP."
- **Antivirus Software:** Sometimes, antivirus software can block the transfer. Check your settings if you encounter issues.

Markup Tools explained



Markup Color Palette



The **Markup Color Palette** gives you complete control over the look and feel of your annotations and drawings. You can select, change, and customize colors to fit your needs and preferences.



Scribble Tool

The Scribble tool lets you handwrite text directly on your iPad and it magically converts your handwriting into typed text.

*can be turned off in Apple Pencil settings



Eraser Tool

The Eraser tool removes markings you've made. You can remove entire objects with a tap (Object Eraser) or precisely erase portions of markings (Pixel Eraser).



Pencil Tool

The Pencil tool aims to replicate the feel of a traditional graphite pencil. It creates a thin, textured line with subtle shading variations for sketching.



Pen Tool

The Pen tool creates a thin, precise line that's perfect for detailed drawings, writing, or adding annotations to an image or document.

Think of it as your "Virtual Flair Pen!" ✍️



Lasso Tool

The Lasso tool lets you precisely select and move, cut, or copy specific parts of a drawing or annotation.

Think of this as your "Virtual Exacto" knife! ✂️



Crayon Tool

The Crayon tool gives you that classic, waxy look and feel of a real crayon! It creates a textured, slightly grainy line with a rich, vibrant color.



Fine Tip Pen Tool

The Fine Tip Pen tool provides a very thin, consistent line weight, ideal for detailed work, precise annotations, or small handwriting.

Think of it as your "Virtual Sharpie!" ✍️



Image Wand

The Image Wand, introduced in iOS 18.2, is a powerful tool that uses AI to generate images. It brings your sketches to life or creates images based on the context of your notes.

Calligraphy Tool

The Calligraphy tool brings the elegance of handwritten calligraphy to your digital creations. It produces beautiful, flowing lines with varying thickness that mimic the strokes of a calligraphy pen.



Highlighter Tool

The Highlighter tool is for highlighting text; it can also be used as a broader marker for coloring in areas or creating a more washed-out, translucent effect in drawings.



Ruler Tool

The Ruler tool helps you draw perfectly straight lines and position elements with precision.



Watercolor Tool

The Watercolor tool creates a soft, translucent brush stroke with a slightly feathered edge, just like a real watercolor brush. Add washes of color, create gradients, and blend hues together for a painterly look.
